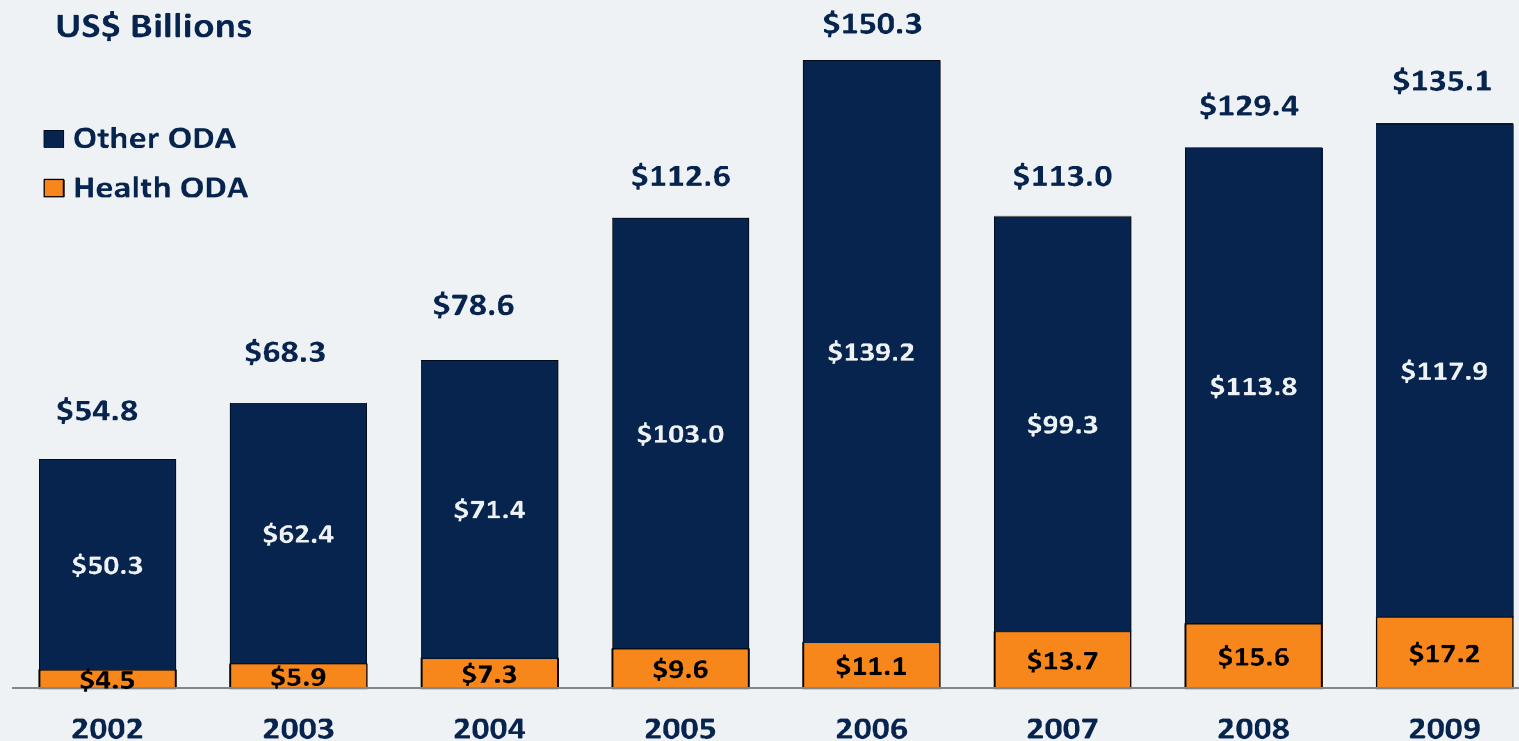

Disbursements for Health and All Other ODA, 2002-2009



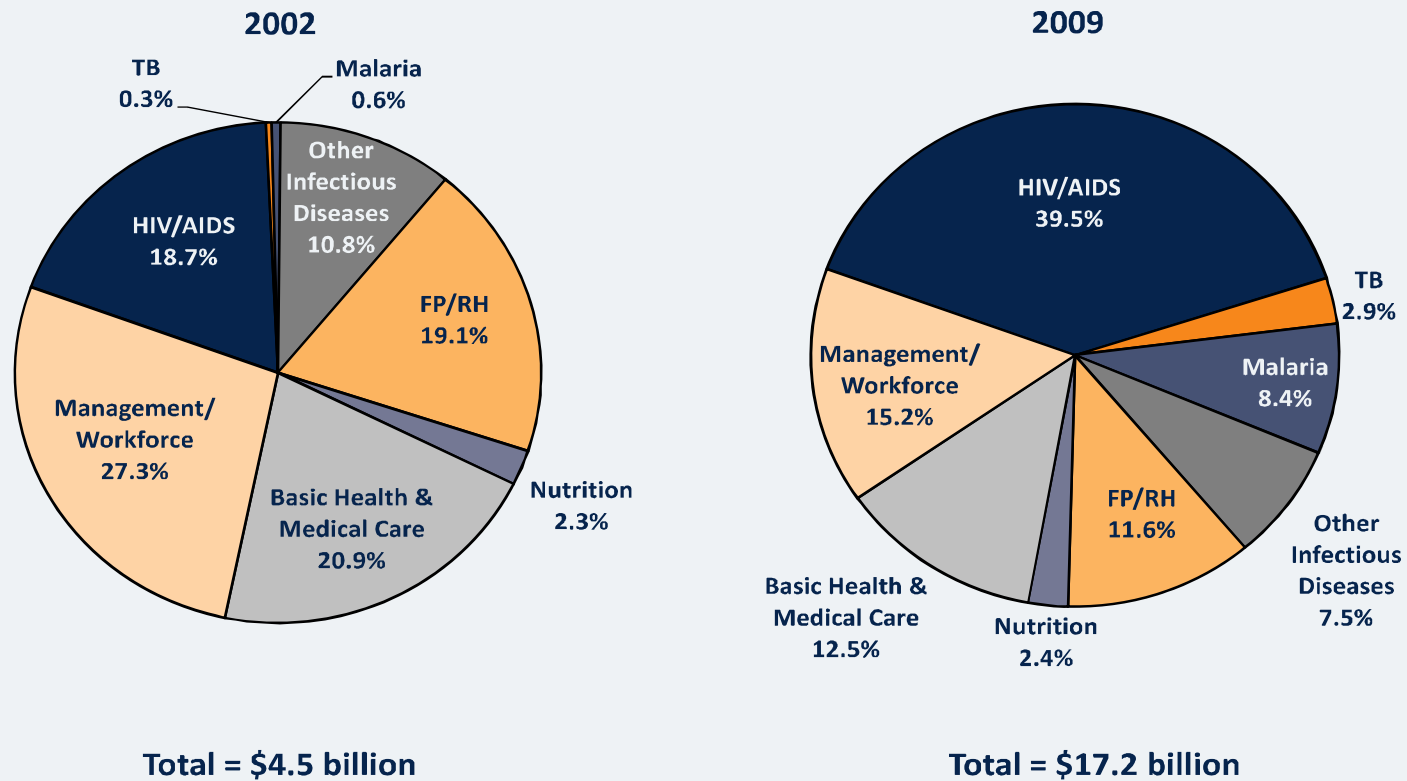

BUT

- “ Donor government funding decreased in 2010 with 10% compared to 2009
- “ Philanthropic HIV funding: dropped 7% compared to 2009
- “ Global Fund had to cancel R11 and cut back on current programs
 - . > risk = disruption of programs
 - . > no scale up for 2 years
- “ Similarly: cut backs in US will impact on PEPFAR

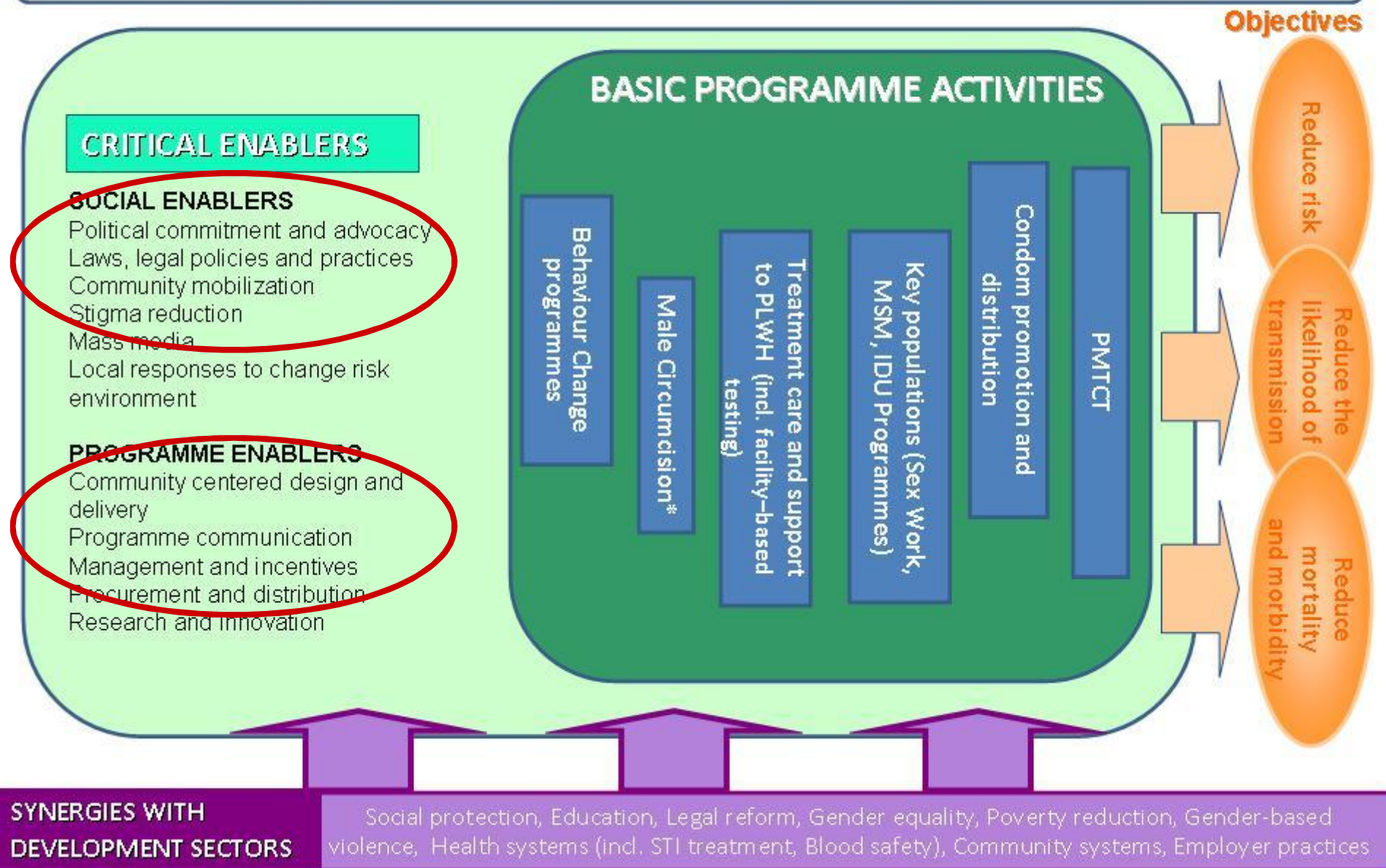

Investment Framework

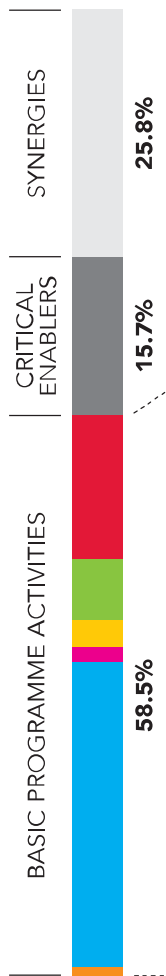
For Whom? Explicitly identify and prioritize populations based on the epidemic profile

How? Use the Human Rights approach to achieve dignity and security

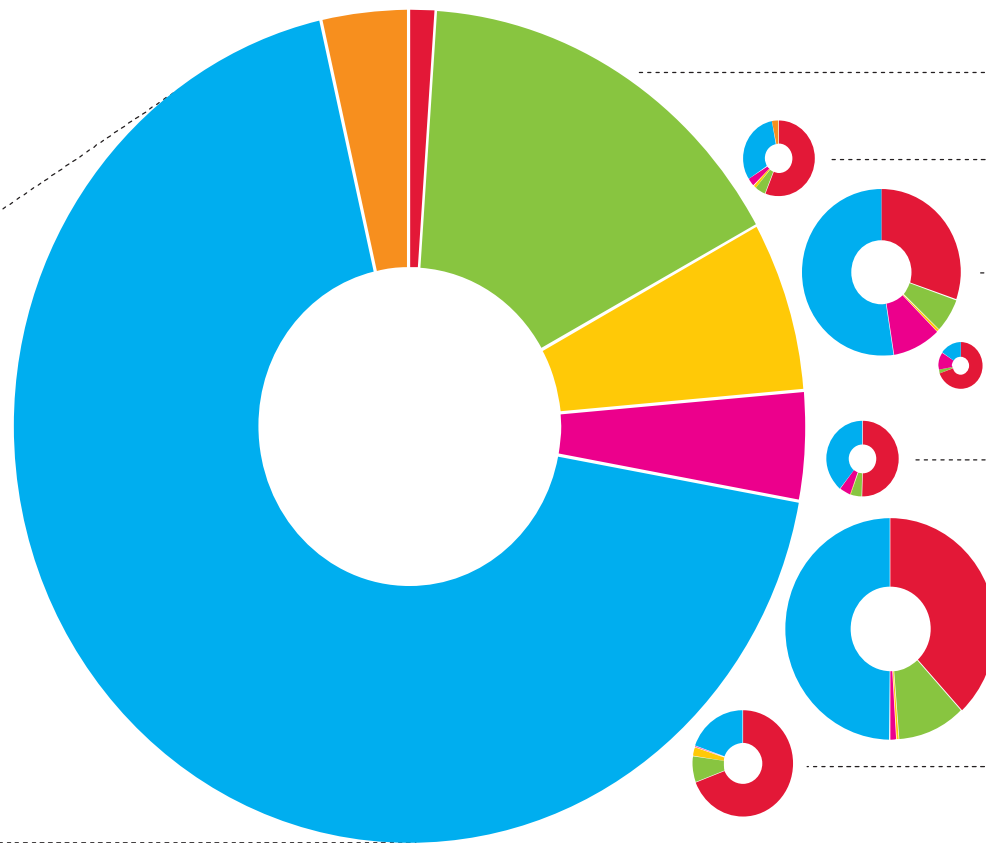


* Applicable in generalized epidemics with low male circumcision prevalence

BASIC PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES BY REGION

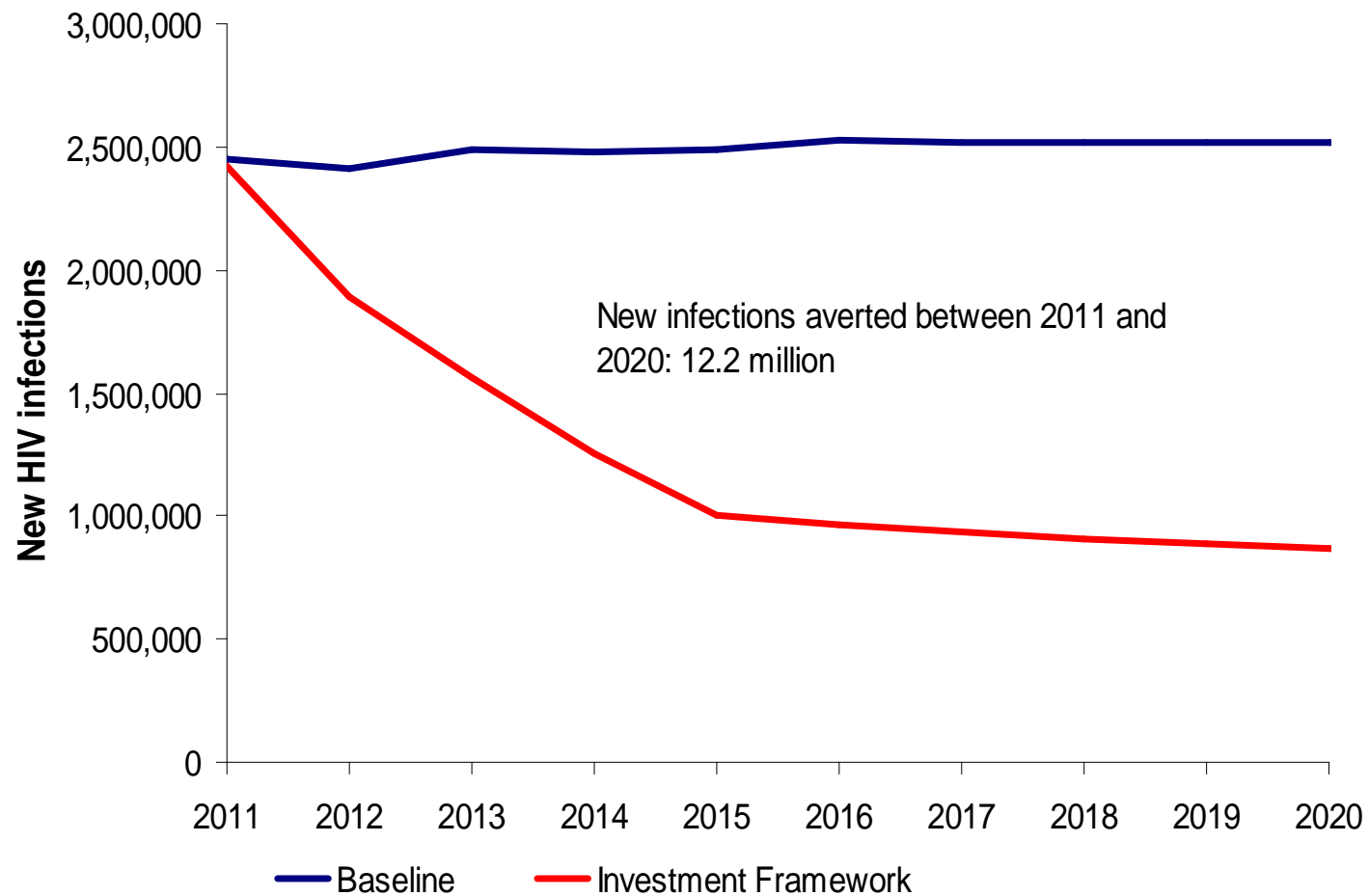

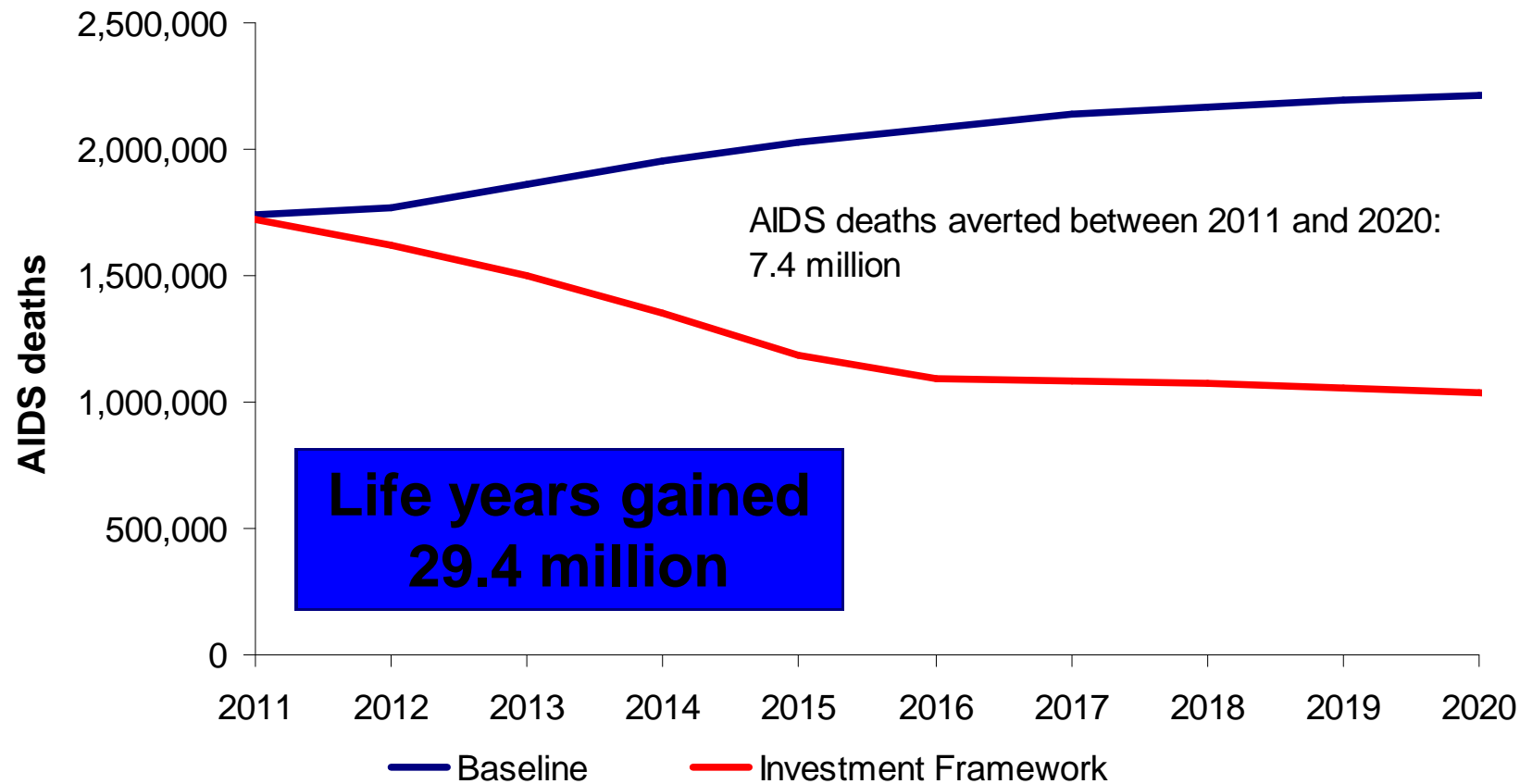

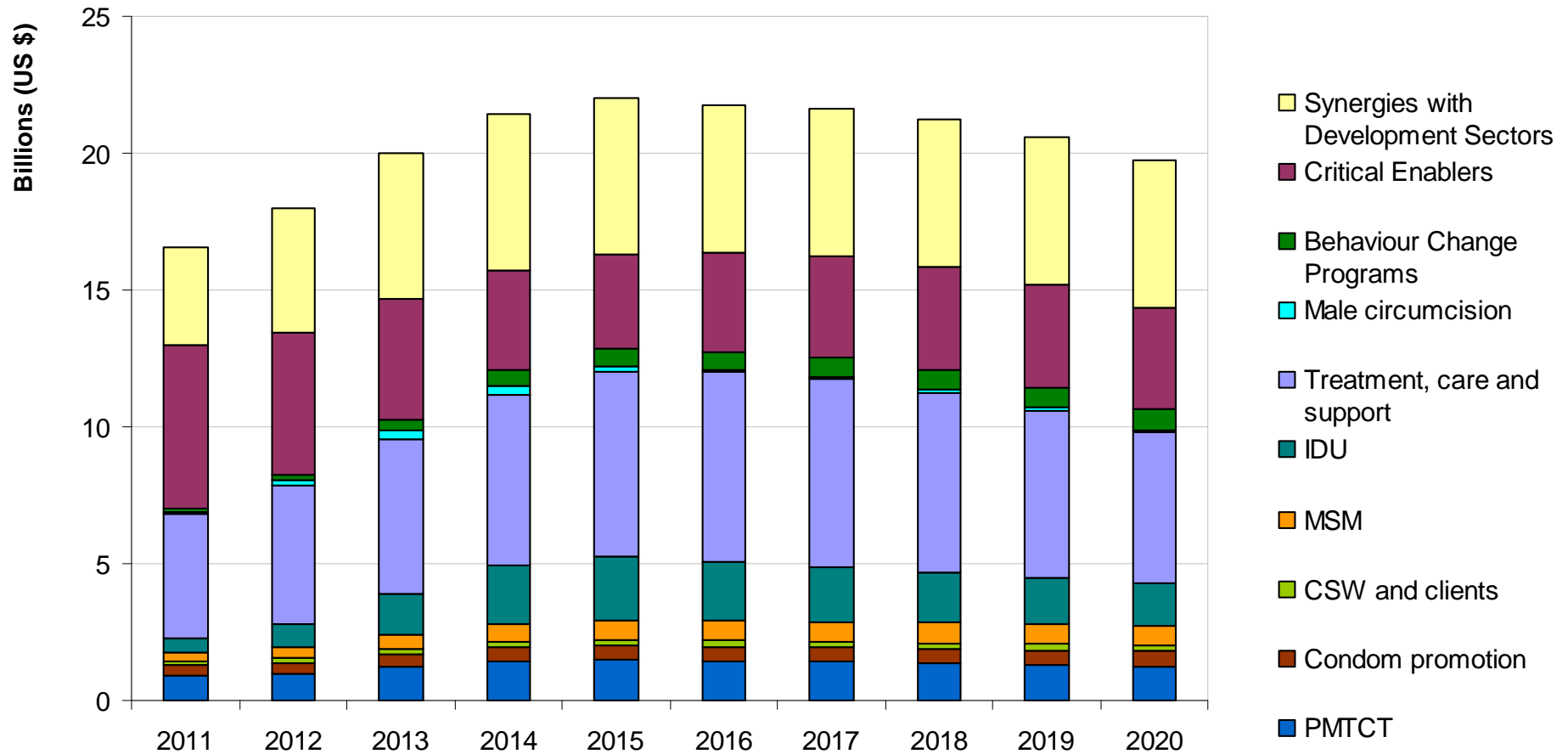
Return on investment: More than 12 million infections averted

Economic cost and returns

2011 to 2020

	Cost/Returns
Total additional investment (over 10 years)	US\$46.5 Billion
Future treatment need averted	US\$40 Billion
Life years gained	US\$1,060 per life year gained

Conclusions

- “ Through a focused and committed approach we can **turn this epidemic around**
- “ With an upfront investment over the coming 5 years, we will be able to **turn cost around**
- “ Time to **overcome the false dichotomy** between prevention and treatment

Lettre ouverte des activistes à la Fondation du Patent Pool et UNITAID à propos de la Licence Gilead/MPP

Le 12 Juillet 2011, La Fondation du Medicines Patent Pool -FMPP (dit communauté de brevets) a annoncé son premier contrat de licence volontaire avec le laboratoire Gilead.
